X MARKS THE SPOT

In all the excitement surrounding the recent General Election, one new Member of Parliament has particularly stood out for me. I sense that he must have been very surprised to have been elected – he only has a razor thin majority of 39 – but I am sure he is very happy. The reason he stands out is because he will be the youngest MP in the House of Commons. His name is Sam Carling and he was born in 2002, which makes me feel my age a bit! His constituents chose him simply by marking an X next to his name on the ballot paper. While this must have brought Sam immense joy, he must now be beginning to discover the weighty responsibilities which accompany being chosen, being elected.

In the reading from Ephesians today we hear these inspiring words: 'Before the world was made God chose us, chose us in Christ, to be holy and spotless and to live through love in his presence.' Just think for a moment what those words mean – from eternity God has chosen you and me for some purpose. If it's good to be chosen for a football team, or for a WhatsApp friendship group, or more seriously for marriage and to start a family, or as a close and significant friend, how much more it is to know that we are chosen by God.

But, with choice comes responsibility. I'm not sure how happy Amos was to be chosen by the Lord to be his prophet – he was called from a life he knew and loved as a farmer and shepherd to prophesy to the people of Israel, on the whole to tell them truths they did not want to hear. In the gospel, Jesus does not simply choose the Twelve, he then sends them forth, tasking them to preach the good news of his kingdom.

We can rejoice that we are elected, that we are chosen by God. But with that choice comes responsibility. By our lives, we are to proclaim the good news of God – in our families and marriages – so hard to do sometimes; in school with all its pressures for success; at work when things can be boring and mundane. May we take to heart the words of the collect at Mass today: may we have the grace 'to reject whatever is contrary to the name of Christ and to strive after all that does it honour'. It's what God has chosen us to do.
