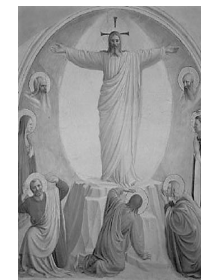

THE NEW LECTIONARY

One of the most important elements of the Mass, when we believe that Jesus Christ comes to be with us in his Body and Blood, is the proclamation of Scripture. Every Sunday we hear four pieces of scripture - usually one reading from the Old Testament, a psalm, a New Testament reading and, of course, the Gospel. Nobody can say that the Catholic Church does not take the scriptures seriously.

As a result of much prayer and study, the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales has asked that we use a new lectionary from Advent Sunday this year. The lectionary is the collection of readings from the scriptures to be used at Mass for every day of the year. The new lectionary is not about the choice of readings - the cycles for Sundays and weekdays will remain the same - but about the translation which will be used. The new Lectionary will use the English Standard Version (Catholic Edition) of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter for the psalms.

You may well be asking why this is happening. The main reason is the intention (already made clear by the present translation of the Roman Missal in 2011) to make the translations we use in the Liturgy of the Church more faithful to the original languages of Hebrew and Greek. Along with this is the need to reflect current biblical scholarship and to provide a text that is more proclaimable and, where appropriate, more inclusive. It is to be hoped that this translation will enable us to hear and read the word of God afresh and also enliven our understanding and deepen our awareness of the riches contained in the Scriptures.

The new volumes for use in church have been beautifully produced by the Catholic Truth Society. We will need a new set for our church, and it may be that you might want to give this to the parish for our worship of God. It will be possible to do this in memory of a departed loved one and for a plate to be put inside the volume. Please contact me, in the first instance, by 15th June, if you are interested in making such a donation.

We must heed the words of Pope Francis: *The word of God unites believers and makes them one people.*
